ANTHONY J. LIDDICOAT

Professor, Centre of Applied Linguistics, University of Warwick

This workshop will examine some core ideas about the pedagogy of teaching languages from an intercultural perspective. It will focus on how a small collection of materials using relatively simple language can be used to promote the processes of noticing, comparing, reflecting and interacting.



Anthony J. Liddicoat is Professor in the Centre for Applied Linguistics at the University of Warwick. His research interests include: language and intercultural issues in education, conversation analysis, and language policy and planning. In recent years his research has focussed on issues relating to the teaching and learning of culture through language study. He is currently co-convenor of the AILA Research Network Intercultural mediation in language and culture teaching and learning/La médiation interculturelle en didactique des langues et des cultures and Executive Editor of Current Issues in Language Planning. He is a former President of the Applied Linguistics Association of Australia and the Australian Federation of Modern Language Teachers Associations.
